Is open to all TBNZ members and is an Open and Graded event, played under general TBNZ playing rules. Anything not covered within these rules will be decided by the Tournament Committee, whose decision will be final.

Entering Averages/Criteria

Competition Events are:

Singles:

Open Men, 170 + average
Open Ladies (including Senior Ladies) 160 + average
Senior Men (Scratch)
Graded (Combined and Handicapped)
Junior (Combined and Handicapped)
Youth (Combined and Scratch)

Doubles:

Open Men including Senior Men (Combined team average of 340+)
Open Ladies including Senior Ladies (Combined team average of 320+)
Graded (Combined team average of 339 or less)
Junior (Combined and handicapped)
Youth (Combined and Scratch)

Trios (mixed):

Open (Combined team average of 480+) with a minimum of one female. Graded (combined team average 479 or less) with a minimum of one female.

All Events:

Open Men
Senior Men
Ladies (including senior ladies)
Graded (Combined and Handicapped)
Junior (Combined and Handicapped)
Youth (Combined and Scratch)

To complete a full All Events entry, bowlers must complete the following events Singles (6 games) (4 games for Juniors) Lane change every 2 games Doubles (3 games)

Mixed Trios - 3 bowlers (3 games)

* Graded Bowlers and Junior will compete with a 100% of 200 handicaps throughout the tournament

All events will be compiled from a Bowlers **BEST** attempt in Singles, Doubles and Mixed Trios.

Graded bowlers can choose to bowl Open Grade by stating it on their entry form.

All bowlers must use their highest average (min 21 games) as of 31^{st} December 2019 or TBNZ Tournament average as at 31^{st} December 2019. The Tournament Committee reserves the right re-grade any bowler.

Bowlers may enter Singles, doubles or trios' multiple times, however must change (at least) one partner. Bowlers can enter any grade of doubles or trios and their scores will be put towards their nominated all events grade.

Masters: The Masters will be determined as follows: Numbers may change depending on entries.

Open Men – Top 10 bowlers from the Open Men's All Events (9 games)

Senior Men – Top 10 bowlers from the Senior Men's All Events (9 games)

Open Ladies (includes senior ladies) - Top 10 bowlers from the Ladies All Events (9 games)

Graded – Top 10 bowlers from the Graded All Events (9 games)

Youth – Top 8 bowlers from the Youth All Events (7 games)

Juniors - Top 8 bowlers from the Youth All Events (7 games)

A bowler may bowl in 2 masters but must complete 2 separate All Events

All Masters are played head to head match play, the winner of each match shall receive <u>20 bonus pins</u>. In the event of a tie, bonus points will be shared equally.

A final positional game shall be played based on OVERALL position following each Masters event.

Entry Close Off:

Entries shall remain open for the duration of the tournament as multiple entries are available. The Tournament Director reserves the right to cancel or modify any squad as needed. Regular squad listings and results shall be posted on the North City Tenpin website www.northcitytenpin.co.nz and on www.tbnz.co.nz

Entry Fee:

Singles: \$70 Juniors: \$45

Doubles: \$40 Teams: \$40

All Events: \$10 (includes \$5 TBNZ fee)

Complete All Events Entry is \$160 Juniors \$140

Masters (Open Men/Ladies) \$50 Masters (Graded/Senior Men) \$50 Masters (Youth/Junior) \$40

Prize fund:

Based on previous years, we estimate this to be over \$8000 (2019 prize fund was \$8620)

A final prize fund listing will be published at the beginning of the tournament.

Overall Champions of Each Grade will also be contested.

Qualifying scores will be carried over to the masters to determine the overall champion.

The Overall Champions of each grade will receive a personalized Wellington Open Champion Shirt.

<u>Dress Code:</u> Bowlers must wear neat and tidy "smart casual" clothing. Collared shirts are requested. Tailored shorts may be worn by Men and Ladies. Jeans/track pants will not be permitted. The Tournament Director will determine suitability as required and no correspondence will be entered.

Check In: Check in for all qualifying squads will be 15 minutes prior to stated times in the tournament program, whilst masters check in will be a closed door check in, 15 minutes prior to start time.

Warm up: Singles Doubles and Masters Bowlers shall receive a 5-minute warm up prior to commencement of their first game. Warm up for trio's events will be 7 minutes. Any lane transfer due to breakdown will have 2 balls, per person per lane if requested by the bowlers who have been transferred.

Protests: Must be brought to the attention (verbally) of the tournament committee immediately and followed in writing to the Tournament Committee within 1 hour of the finish of the event the protest relates to. The tournament committee will adjudicate, and their decision will be final.

<u>Ties:</u> In the event of a tie for a prize pay-out, the prize shall be split between the bowlers involved. In the event of a tie for a masters qualifying position or overall champion, a one game roll off will be used, followed by repeated $9^{th}/10^{th}$ frame roll offs if the tie is not broken within the game.

General: Standard TBNZ playing rules will be in use throughout the event. The tournament committee will also be monitoring slow bowling and lane walking.

Failure to comply with the general rules of the tournament will result in the following card warning system being employed.

White Card: General warning to participant in regard to a rules breach or abusive offence. Yellow Card: Formal warning of a rules breach – zero score for the bowlers next frame. Repeated rules breaches will result in disqualification from the event.

Smoking or consuming/being under the influence of Alcohol is not permitted whilst competing.

Bowlers are asked to respect the North City Tenpin Café And not bring their own food and drinks into the centre.
