Eligibility:

This tournament is open to all current financial Junior/Youth members of Tenpin Bowling New Zealand Inc. (TBNZ).

- Junior bowlers must be under the age of 18 prior to 1 January 2021.
- Youth bowlers must be under the age of 21 prior to 1 January 2021. Junior bowlers may also enter the Youth division.
- Junior Bantam bowlers must be under the age of 13 prior to 1 January 2021, whose averages are below 160 for boys and below 150 for girls.

All bowlers are required to ensure that they are 2021 financial TBNZ members prior to the tournament. If not, bowlers will be required to pay the TBNZ membership fee if proof cannot be produced.

Playing Rules:

All TBNZ general playing and tournament rules will apply.

Anti-Doping Policy:

All bowlers who enter this tournament may be tested for compliance with the TBNZ Anti-Doping Policy. Many drugs remain present in the body for months after use. If you are unsure about your drug free status, do NOT enter this tournament.

Divisions:

In the Junior division, there will be three divisions, an Open Boys Division, Open Girls Division and a Graded Division. Bowlers will only be eligible to compete in the Masters in the All Events Division which they have entered. The Graded Division will be mixed (i.e. boys and girls will compete against each other), this will be handicapped.

The Youth division will consist of an open men's and open women's division. These will be scratch. All Youth bowlers must enter the Open division.

In the Junior Bantam division, there will be only one division, competing for Singles and All Events. This division will be mixed and handicapped.

Events:

In all divisions except Junior Bantams, the events to be played shall be Singles, Doubles and four person Teams. Please note the Junior Bantams division is only Singles and All-Events. Junior Bantam bowlers must bowl in the Junior Graded Doubles and Teams to complete their All-Events.

Bowlers will be eligible for the All Events, as long as they have entered the singles, doubles and teams, and paid the All-Events entry fee.

Multiple Entries:

Multiple entries will be accepted within each division as follows:

- Teams: At least two members of the team must be different.
- Doubles: You may only bowl with same partner once.
- Singles: Each entry must be in a separate division, subject to eligibility.
- All Events: Each bowler is permitted to enter a maximum of 2 All-Events divisions.
- Bowlers may only enter the doubles event a maximum of 2 times per division."

The same Teams/Doubles combination can bowl together again as long as each entry is in a different Division and all bowlers are eligible to bowl in that division.

All Events:

An All Events Champion will be declared for each division. A bowler's score in their Singles and first attempt bowled in Doubles and Teams will count towards their All Events score, regardless of the division in which the events are bowled. Bowlers must indicate on the entry form which All Events division they are entering.

Multiple All-Events:

If a bowler enters the All Events in two (2) divisions, bowlers must complete two (2) separate sets of singles/doubles/teams and indicate on the entry form which All Events divisions they are entering by ticking the relevant All Events boxes. Bowlers may bowl in two (2) separate Master's if they qualify and the Masters are held at different times.

The \$10 All-Events Fee is payable for every All-Events division entered.

Number of Games per Event:

Doubles and Teams events shall consist of three games per bowler, without lane changes.

Singles shall consist of six games per bowler, with a lane change after every two games.

Bantam Singles shall consist of four games per bowler, with a lane change after two games.

Lane movements will be 2 pairs of lanes, either to the left or right, at each lane change. If 3 pairs or less are being used, lane changes will be 1 pair.

Entries:

All entries must be accompanied by full entry fees & received by **10 January 2022**. Late entries will only be accepted at the discretion of the Tournament Manager, or the Tournament Director if the tournament has begun.

Payment:

Full payment must be received by 10 January 2022

Payment must be made to the TBNZ Bank Account. The account number is **03 0227 0331250 00**, please include your name and '**JNR NATS**' in the reference details so we may identify your payment.

Entry into any squad is not guaranteed until entry fees are paid in full. Until then all entries will be added to the reserve list of the squad entered. A more detailed explanation of this rule can be found on the squad listing page.

Entering Averages – Junior Bowlers:

Bowlers entering this tournament shall use their current TBNZ tournament average obtained from the TBNZ Rankings page as at **1 January 2022**. The average used must be established over a minimum of 21 games. If a bowler does not have a TBNZ tournament average, then their highest league average based over a minimum of 21 games must be submitted as at **1 January 2022**. If a bowler cannot provide proof of any average they must compete in the open division.

All Junior Boys holding an average of 160 or higher must enter the Junior Boys Open All-Events. All Junior Girls holding an average of 150 or higher must enter the Junior Girls Open All-Events. This also applies to bowlers aged under 13 prior to 1 January 2021.

As there is no Youth Graded division, all Youth bowlers must enter the relevant Open division, regardless of average.

Review of Bowlers Averages:

The Tournament Committee reserves the right to review any bowlers entering average prior to the start of the tournament and re-grade any bowler where necessary. The average used in the Graded Masters Final will be the bowlers approved entering average for the tournament.

Handicaps:

The Graded division is handicapped on 90% of a 200 base.

Replacements or Substitutes:

All replacements or changes to the original entry must be reported and approved by the Tournament Director at least 30 minutes prior to the scheduled bowling time. The average of the replacement cannot change the grading of the original entry.

Check-In Qualifying Rounds:

Bowlers must check-in **15 minutes** prior to the scheduled starting time. Squads may commence once the check-in time has passed.

Check-In Masters:

Bowlers must sign in and pay **15 minutes** prior to the scheduled starting time, if a bowler is absent at this time, they will be replaced by the next available qualifier.

Check-in Masters Finals Reserves:

Available reserves must also check-in no later than **15 minutes** prior to the scheduled start time and may be invited to contest the Masters Finals in that Division.

Lane Draw:

Bowlers starting lanes will be decided by **RANDOM** lane draw.

Practice:

Each bowler will be entitled to the following practice times prior to the start of that event:

- Singles: Five (5) minutes practice before the first block only.
- Doubles: Five (5) minutes practice
- ⊙ Teams: ten (10) minutes practice
- Masters: five (5) minutes practice before the first game only.

Masters Events:

A Masters event will be held for each grade as follows:

Open Youth Boys - 10 finalists

⊙ Open Junior Boys – 8 finalists

Open Youth Girls - 8 finalists

Open Junior Girls - 8 finalists

Junior Graded – 10 finalists

 Junior Bantams - 6 finalists

The finalists from each All Events grade will be invited to contest a Masters event for that particular division. The finalists will contest a series of round robin games based on the number of finalists. Bonus pins will be awarded 20 for a win, 10 for a draw.

The bowler with highest total pinfall including bonus pins will be declared the winner of their respective Masters Finals event.

The Tournament Committee reserves the right to reduce/increase the number of participants in a Masters event depending on the number of entries.

National Champions and Representation:

The National Champion for each division will be determined by the bowler with the highest combined pinfall from the All Events and the Masters, including bonus points. Bowlers who are seeking to represent New Zealand must compete in the relevant Open Division All Events.

National Champions will be declared in the following Divisions:

Open Youth Boys

Open Youth Girls

Junior Graded

Open Junior Boys

Open Junior Girls

Junior Bantams

National Champions in the Open Division along with the 2nd and 3rd placings may be invited into the National Junior/Youth Squad. Any bowler who has declined an invitation into the National Junior/Youth Squad in the current year, will not receive a further invite into the National Junior/Youth Squad. All squad members must abide by the Training Squad Rules to remain eligible for any New Zealand Team.

Tardy Bowlers:

Any bowler not ready to bowl at the scheduled starting time will not be permitted to catch up and will commence at the frame being bowled.

Slow Bowling:

Slow bowling will not be tolerated, except when caused by lane breakdowns or circumstances outside of the bowlers' control. Players preparing to step on to the approach and deliver a ball shall have the following rights and obligations:

- a) Players shall be ready to bowl when it is their turn and shall not delay the start of their approach or delivery.
- b) A bowler is given 30 seconds from the moment the previous bowler steps down from the approach to the time the ball leaves the hand of the bowler. Tournament Officials may use stop watches to randomly check the timing of the bowlers in their delivery.
- c) If a player does not observe the procedures outlined in a) and b), it shall be construed as slow bowling. A player failing to observe these procedures shall be warned by an authorised tournament official as follows:
 - i) A verbal warning will be given (no penalty)
 - ii) A verbal warning for the second offence (no penalty)
 - iii) For the third and each succeeding offence during the event, the penalty shall be a zero pinfall for that frame.

Lane Changing:

On completion of each game/block, bowlers or teams in the qualifying rounds or the Masters Finals can immediately move to their next lane when it becomes clear, and commence bowling when their opponent arrives, and their names appear on the screen.

Presentations:

Presentations will be made at the times specified by the Tournament Committee.

General Conditions:

- Only participants, scorers and officials shall be allowed in the players' area.
- Drinking and eating in the players area is not permitted.
- The consumption of alcohol is not permitted while competing or if you have events still to complete for the day.
- Smoking/Vaping is not permitted while competing in any event.
- The use of abrasives or cleaning fluids on bowling balls or changing the surface of a bowling ball in any way is only
 permitted at the completion of each block of games and MUST be done away from the playing area.
- Bowlers are always expected to exercise the highest standards of sportsmanship.
- Abuse towards centre staff, centre equipment, other competitors or members of the public will not be tolerated.

Dress Code:

- Short sleeved, collared shirt or any approved bowling branded shirt must be worn.
- Boys may wear dress trousers or dress shorts that require a belt.
- Girls may wear either dress trousers, dress shorts, skirts, skorts or 34 pants.
- No denims, beach shorts, cargo type pants or tracksuit pants will be permitted.
- A clean and tidy dress standard of dress will be required by competitors, at all times.
- No Headwear can be worn, except for cultural reasons. This includes hats and headbands.

Ties:

If there is a tie for the National Champion. A one game roll off will take place to decide the overall placings. Masters Finals: In the event of a tie for the last qualifying position for the Masters Finals, a one game roll off will take place to determine the final qualifier. All other ties for positions/medals will be shared.

Card System:

White card - General warning to participant to any rules breach or unsportsmanlike conduct. Yellow card - Official warning to the participant to any rules breach or unsportsmanlike conduct.

Red Card - Immediate disqualification of the participant from the tournament.

NB: Any physical or verbal abuse towards centre staff, centre equipment, other competitors or members of the public will result in cards being issued.

Special Note:

Any matters which arise and are not covered herein shall be decided by the Tournament Committee.

Disclaimers:

The Tournament Officials, Centre management/staff will not be held responsible for any injuries or loss/damage of belongings/equipment during the Championships.
