### 2022 Kegel Open Rules and Tournament Information

**Stage 1:** All Bowlers complete 10 games of qualifying in 5 x 2 game blocks, moving after each block. (Pinfall carried forward) SINGLE ENTRY ONLY

15 Bowlers comprising of the top 12 qualifiers + the top Senior Man, Youth and Open Lady (Including Senior Ladies) bowl a further 5 games. If any of the top bowlers from each division have qualified for stage 2 through pinfall from stage 1, the automatic spot will move to the first qualifier in that division NOT to qualify via pinfall from stage 1. (All pinfall carries forward)

Stage 3: Top 8 final (NRL finals format) Pinfall reset. One game match

The winner of the 2022 Kegel Open will be the winner of the grand final and will win \$1000 cash, and entry fees to the 2023 Kegel Queensland Open in March 2023 (dates tbc) The winner will also receive free entry into the 2023 Kegel Open at North City Tenpin to defend their title.

- This is a scratch tournament open to all 2022 TBNZ members. All games will be played in accordance with standard TBNZ playing rules.
- The Tournament Committee reserves the right to alter the format to suit entry numbers as required.
- Female and Youth bowlers will receive an 8 pin per game handicap for all stages, including match play.
- Slow bowling will not be permitted, bowlers will have 30 seconds to complete their shot, once their lane is available. Bowlers will give way 1 lane each side.
- Dress Code appropriate bowling attire to be worn, dress shorts for men and mid-thigh length shorts for women are permitted. Jeans, tights or track pants are not acceptable.
- The Tournament Director reserves the right to check any bowler's equipment at any time.
   Any equipment found to breach TBNZ regulations will result in disqualification with no claim on any prizemoney.

- Bowlers must check in 15 minutes prior to the advertised time for qualifying and each of the final stages. Bowlers not checking in will be replaced by the first available reserve without warning.
- Ties A tie for the last place in any qualifying stage will be broken by the highest game during the preceding stage. A tie for 15<sup>th</sup> place (matchplay) will be determined by a 1 game playoff, followed by sudden death 1 ball bowling until the tie is broken. A tie during the Finals will bowl a 9<sup>th</sup>/10<sup>th</sup> frame rolloff, followed by 1 ball sudden death until the tie is broken.
- Smoking/Vaping, Consumption of Alcohol and use of mobile phones are not permitted whilst competing.
- Outside food and drinks are not permitted within North City Tenpin.

Prizefund Prizefund is based on 40 entries and will be adjusted based on entry levels.

The 1<sup>st</sup> place prize of \$1000 and Entry fee 2023 Kegel Queensland Open is
